Preston Church Dedication Set

Christ Lutheran Program Scheduled

PRESTON — Dedication of the new Christ Lutheran Church and educational building here will be held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday.

Dr. E. C. Reinertson of St. Paul, president of the Southeastern Minnesota District of the American Lutheran Church, will officiate. Worship services are scheduled for 9 and 10:30 a.m. and a dinner will be served at noon for all members and friends.

The new church contains a nave seating 550 with overflow seating for 100; 20 classrooms, a large fellowship hall; officers; library and service rooms. Architects were Cerny Associates of Minneapolis and the contractor was Century Construction Co. of Preston.

Christ Lutheran Church is the result of a merger in 1958 between two Preston congregations, Grace of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and St. Paul's of the American Lutheran Church.

Former pastors of the two merging congregations will take part in the various services. They are: The Rev. Richard Vordale of Milwaukee; the Rev. E. G. Gaede, Albert Lea; the Rev. Philip Hansen, White Bear Lake; and the Rev. Gerhard Bunge, Oelwein,, Iowa.

Present pastor is the Rev. Rolf Boe who has served Christ Lutheran Church since the merger in 1958. Services have been held in the new church the past two Sundays.



WEATHER IDEAL FOR **DEDICATION SUNDAY** OF CHRIST CHURCH

The weather was ideal last Sunday for the dedication of the new Christ Lutheran Church, Preston, and all the services occurred on schedule. A total of 940 persons attended the two services in the morning, and 750 attended the dedication service in the afternoon.

Only two things occurred that weren't scheduled. Pastor Boe's daughter Katherine became ill in the afternoon, and Mrs. Boe had to take her to St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester. Katherine's condition improved overnight and she returned home Monday afternoon. She had suffered an attack of intestinal flu, and for some hours underwent considerable pain.

The other incident occurred late Sunday forenoon. Al Christianson, an officer of the church, accompanied by his 31/2-year-old son Danny, was delivering some baking to the Lud Gartner home for use on Monday following the funeral of Mrs. Phil Gartner. He parked the car in front of the house and put the transmission in Park; and during the brief period he was absent, Danny took the transmission out of Park, and the car head-ed for the steep hill south of the Gartner home. Instead of going down the hill, the car entered the lawn of the Hulda Hahn home, grazed a large tree, went under a clothesline, missed the southeast corner of the house only by inches, went between another tree and a bush, and finally came to a stop in the Hahn garden. Miraculously Danny escaped with only scratches and bruises, nor was the car dam-aged. He was released after treatment of his minor injuries by Dr. J. P. Nehring. Apparently when the car started moving Danny attempted to get out the door, which accounts for the fact that one of his shoes was found near the tree up the hill that the car grazed. When the car finally stopped, he was thrown out of the vehicle.

New Christ Church to Be Dedicated Sunday

Dr. E. R. Reinertson Will Give Sermon at Afternoon Services

The new Christ Lutheran Church, Preston, will be dedicated this coming Sunday, August 20. There will be two morning services at 9:00 a. m. and 10:30 a. m., and the service of dedication will take

place at 2:30 p. m.

Former Pastor Richard Vordale, now of Milwaukee, will give the sermon at the 9:00 a. m. service, and former Pastor E. G. Gaede, now of Albert Lea, will give the sermon at the 10:30 a. m. service. The girls' choir will sing at the first morning service, and the senior choir at the second

morning service.

Reading the scriptures at the service of dedication in the af-ternoon will be Seminarian Gale Chilson of Preston; former Pastor Philip Hansen, now of White Bear Lake; the Rev. Robert Taylor of Harmony; the Rev. M. A. Braaten of Houston; the Rev. Lawrence Brynestad of Winona; and the Rev. Walter Pilgrim of Spring Valley. Dr. E. C. Reinertson, president of the Southeastern Minnesota District of the American Lutheran Church, will give the de-dication sermon. Former Pastor Gerhard Bunge, now of Oelwein, Iowa, will give the closing prayer and Lord's Prayer at the service of dedication and will provide organ music from 1:30 to 2:15. Dinner at noon and coffee following the afternoon service will be served by the ladies of the church in the Fellowship Hall. All friends of the church in the community are invited to attend these services.

Last week leveling of the church grounds was completed, and on Monday and Tuesday of this week the grounds were sodded. The sodding will be completed tomorrow (Friday) and the men of the church are asked to turn out to complete the work that day.

Farewell Open House For Pastor Boe Family

A farewell open house for Pastor and Mrs. Rolf D. Boe and children will be held at Christ Lutheran Church, Preston, tomorrow (Friday) evening, August 25, beginning at 7:00 o'clock, for the congregation and friends. Pastor Boe will conduct his last service here at 10:30 this coming Sunday morning, August 27, and the family will then depart for Mt. Prospect, Illinois, from where he will commute to Chicago for his new position with the American Lutheran Church in its national of-fice.
