Holy Week – Invite, Reflect, And Celebrate Our New Life in Christ

Holy Week is observed from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, and you likely noticed there is a lot of church during Holy Week. Why do we need this much church? It is an intense week, filled with triumph, betrayal, despair, and joy. As Christians, living into our faith means following along on each part of Jesus' journey – and forming faith step by step.

As Holy Week approaches, prepare by gathering Wednesdays through March 20 for soup supper (6 pm) and worship (7 pm). If 7 pm worship is too late, you are welcome to come for the meal and fellowship only. For worship, we are using the Holden Evening Prayer service, filled with beautiful music and prayer.

The Meaning of Holy Week and Worship

Palm Sunday March 24 marks the beginning of Holy Week. We rejoice with the crowds as Jesus triumphantly enters the city of Jerusalem, waving palms and shouting "Hosanna!" In our 9 am service recognize the energy of the crowds gathered around Jesus as he was welcomed to Jerusalem.

Maundy Thursday March 28 takes its name from the Latin word for "commandment," and we remember when Jesus told his disciples, "A new commandment I give to you: Love one another." 7 pm worship will include communion and individual absolution, or forgiveness with the oil marking the cross on our forehead just as the ashes did on Ash Wednesday. Worship on March 28 is at 7:00 pm.

Good Friday March 29 commemorates the day when our Lord gave his life to save us from our sins. It is a very humbling service, as we contemplate the cost that Jesus paid for our redemption. This is the one day out of the church year when it is not appropriate to celebrate Holy Communion. On this day the body of our Lord is broken on the cross—not at the table; and on this day no celebrations are appropriate.

There will be two opportunities to worship on Good Friday:

*Holy Week Hike, 3:00 pm (for all ages): Join us at the Root River Trailhead parking lot, near the Trailhead Inn, at 3 pm for a Holy Week Hike. On this hike we will use storytelling to wonder about the emotions of Holy Week through a child's eyes, moving from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. This walk will be about 1 and ½ miles, on the biking/hiking trail. Come as you are, stroller and/or hiking sticks welcome!

***Tenebrae Worship:** Our 7:00 pm worship in the Sanctuary will offer readings on the seven last words of Christ.

Easter Sunday, *March 31*, is the day of the resurrection and we gather for a joyous celebration of God's victory over sin and death. Gather at 9:00 am for the story of our salvation, music, and Holy Communion.

We are Easter people and our journey through Lent doesn't end at the cross or even the empty tomb but continues each day in resurrected life, as we walk with one another toward the future that is both promised and deeply needed. *All services in our sanctuary stream on our Facebook Page, Christ Lutheran Church-Preston.*


A basket of envelopes has been placed in the Narthex, each envelope contains 1, 3, or 5 congregation members names and addresses. CLC
