Ordinary Time: An Invitation to Read and Reflect on God's Presence Pastor Kris Hertsgaard Kincaid

How is your summer looking, people of God of Christ Lutheran? Are you getting a break from the busyness of the school year? Are you part of our agricultural community working more hours in the summertime than wintertime? Have you made it a priority to get outdoors, or spend time with family or friends? Or are you moving with the flow of life, finding it enough to process one day or week at a time? Like our secular lives, the church year is divided into seasons. The two central cycles of Christmas and Easter focus on the person and work of Christ. Now we are in Ordinary Time, and despite this title our lectionary lessons are far from ordinary. We have returned to the gospel readings from Mark, and his writings urge us to discern how God is calling us and then proclaim, bear witness to, and live out God's ongoing will for the world God so deeply loves.

This summer I invite you to join me in discovering God's presence and taking a deeper look into this season of the church year through the lens of *An Altar in the World: A Geography of Faith* by preacher and author Barbara Brown Taylor. In this book, Taylor shares how she learned to find God beyond the church walls by embracing the sacred as a natural part of everyday life. She also shows us how to discover altars everywhere we go and in nearly everything we do as we learn to live with purpose, pay attention, slow down, and revere the world we live in (Amazon.com).

Devotion Reflection-Pastor Kris

New business:

1) Use of Facilities—discussion

Damage deposit for members, non-members and non-profit organizations along with fee increase for non-members. Other - Do we need to have a small nominal fee to church members to assist with replenishing supplies in the kitchen (such as garbage bags). Having an individual in the church during events that is in charge of the sound/video system. This would be for a non-member only. Michael Johnson made a motion that both members and non-members will pay a \$200 damage deposit with a 30 day return window after the event if the church is without damage. The motion also included that the rental fees would be increased by double for non-members and if they want to use the tech system (more then just sound), there will be an additional charge for a tech individual, which would be about \$50/hour. Second by Darrell Olson.

- 2) Ammparo—June 16—Kathy Chatelaine, Asst to Bishop Hassanally. Local & global Missions. Service group is serving root beer floats
- 3) June 23 "Blessing of the Bikes"--discussion on how this is going to be organized. Bike, helmet or lock can be brought. Individuals who will have bikes will be asked to park in the back of the church for blessing before the bike ride. Andy Bunge has not called Lanesboro to see if the park is available.
- 4) 2024 Synod Assembly giving report—Pastor Kris.

 Email from the Bishop that they met their goal and exceeded it. Donation from our church: Pastor Kris will ask Amanda what the total was.
- 5) Update on Vacation Bible School (VBS)—Pastor Kris 34 children registered. They had 26 last night. Attendance has been good.
- 6) Pastor's Discretionary Fund—is this something we need to establish? This would be a fund to address needs among the congregation and community members. Payments for food, rent, utilities and medical bill for those in need are typical uses of the fund. Amanda has Preston Bucks that she has provided individuals in the past, however she currently does not have any available. In the past there was a discretionary fund or memorial funds have been used to purchase Preston Bucks.
- 7) Budget Review-Katie Marzolf-Harstad

Bills from Preston Foods for kitchen items such as paper products for events. This was previously paid by WELCA. Add line item: supplies under the general fund. Katie Marzolf-Harstad will discuss this with Pam Ristau.

8) The expenses of the boiler checks are being reviewed. Excessive Property Committee would like to hire a custodian that would check the boiler along with completing additional maintenance in the church. Will request that Pam Ristau continue to provide percentages of cost.

- 9) Memorial gifts/funds:
- 10) AED: replaced for 5 years; Previous was expired.
- 11) Pastor Kris: "Forest Bathing" \$250, however she would also take a donation for mileage in place of this fee. Monday July 29, 6-8 pm. Provided by Project Get Outdoors, it is a cleansing outdoor activity. This could be hosted at the Trail Head in Preston to use the bike trail and park area. Andy Bunge motions that we use \$250 from the memorial fund towards "Forest Bathing." Second by: Bruce Hoff.

Old business:

- 1) Property Team recommends that we hire a full-time custodian like we had before. Discussion. Darrell Olson: keep Robert for cleaning but have another individual to do other maintenance at the church. Consider FT or PT position. Property Team will review the description of both positions and see specifically what the property team is looking for in this position. Information placed in the bulletin to see if there are members interested in helping with minor maintenance/custodian tasks that are currently not being completed. Michael Johnson sent email to Amanda.
- 2) Extension of the duct work in the basement for better air exchange (see Property Team Report). It would cost ~\$13,000. Consider budget for next year versus using the money remaining from the ramp fund. Property team to get additional quotes. Table until August.
- 3) Evangelism: Pastor Kris and Jennifer Picket will meet to discuss how we can reach out to members to provide their gifts to the church for "Things they like to do or how they can help serve the church." They plan to meet in June.

All reports and next meeting's agenda will be emailed one week prior to our meeting. Please have all items for the agenda to me a week in advance.


