"Advent Calls Us to Wait"

When did you first spot a display of Christmas candy in the stores? When I was looking for something for Halloween the seasonal aisle was stocked with Christmas items. My response was, "No! Not yet!" And now, have you noticed when Advent is barely beginning, Christmas seems to be in full swing? Shopping days are counting down. Christmas trees and decorations are coming up. Rehearsals for Christmas concerts are underway. The Craft and Bake sale is just days away. How do we wait, when Christmas is in full swing?

This Advent season, the Old Testament texts reveal the prophecies spoken by Jeremiah, Malachi, Zephaniah, and Micah and remind us of waiting. These passages foretell of Christ's coming and proclaim God's presence in our world. When God pointed to the stars and told Abraham one day his offspring would outnumber them, Abraham and his descendants waited. (Genesis 15:5). When Jesus proclaimed, "The Kingdom of God is in your midst" (Luke 17:21) God's divine presence was made known through the healings, signs, and miracles of Jesus. God's restoration began with Jesus' ministry and we wait for when restoration will be complete. As we wait, we lean into the deep theological convictions in the Old Testament texts.

- God makes and keeps promises.
- God desires God's people to live in safety and peace.
- God will raise up a savior for God's people.

These convictions sustained the Israelites 2000 years ago and continue to sustain us. Our fast-paced world jumps ahead to the next big thing – and Christmas arrives before Advent. Gloriously, Advent invites us to take a break from our weary world and wait. If I look to the stars or sit beneath shimmering lights, I slow down. If I listen to God's call or read God's Word. I slow down.

Slowing down lets us recognize God's presence and hear God's call for us at this particular time. As people share stories of generosity during worship, I learn more about how the people of Christ Lutheran hear God's call and share their time, talents, and financial gifts. We do God's work by living our faith active in love. Thank you for your faithful generosity that provides ministries and mission for God's people near and far.

Generosity Moment: Meeting the Needs of the World through Crafting

Often as I sit in my office, I hear Amanda answering a phone call from someone outside of the community who is asking about this year's Craft and Bake Sale. Who are these crafters and how does their generosity show up in our community and beyond? Christ's Crafters is a group of women that was started approximately seven years ago. The group meets on the first and third Thursday of the month at 1:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall (January-November) and averages about 10-12 people each session. The initial purpose of the group was to make items to sell in the craft and bake sale room at the Norwegian buffet. As a stand-alone Craft and Bake Sale, it continues to be a hub of generosity. In 2023, the group donated \$14,500 in proceeds from the Craft and Bake Sale to the church council and asked them to disperse these funds to both benevolence and the general fund. In addition, Christ's Crafters work on other projects that benefit local and global missions.

Theologian Frederick Buechner defines vocation as, "The place where your deep gladness meets the world's deepest need." Through their diverse projects, Christ crafters meet the needs of people far and wide. They make the fleece blankets for our graduating seniors, baptism quilts, prayer shawls, mission quilts for Lutheran World Relief, and Easter goodie bags for local shut-ins, as well as Kleenex covers for the Veterans Home and Veterans Cemetery. Over the past few years, they have also partnered with the Volunteer Office at Mayo Clinic-St. Mary's Hospital to make chemo caps, prayer shawls, pediatric surgical caps, and fleece animals. They also make fleece animals for Bundles of Love. The group is also responsible for the centerpieces for the tables in the Fellowship Hall.

Their behind-the-scenes generosity offers love and care to God's people. Diane Johnson comments, "Christ's Crafters is a great way to spend time together. Members have various skill sets and are more than willing to help each other to complete whatever project they may be working on at the time." Each afternoon session ends with coffee, treats, and conversation.

The majority of the supplies for items made by this group are donated. If you have items to donate, they can be left in the quilt room across from the kitchen. Monetary donations to Christ's Crafters are always welcome to help purchase supplies for projects. Christ's Crafters - thank you for sharing your time, talents, and treasures.
