The human body has 206 bones, 639 muscles, and about 6 pounds of skin, along with ligaments, cartilage, veins, arteries, blood, fat, and more. Every time we hear a sound; every time we take a step; every time we take a breath, hundreds of different parts work together so that what we experience is a single move, our minds and bodies working as one unit. (Raylynne Jay Whitley, Feasting on the Word. Year C. Volume 1.)

The imagery above helps us imagine what it means to be the body of Christ. When we imagine our body, we easily name our head, shoulders, knees and toes. However, we often find it more difficult to name where we fit into the body of the church. Baptized into the love of God, Christ Jesus, and the Holy Spirt, we all belong and are called to participate.

We belong. We feel deeply the need to belong. Corinthians speaks to our relationships, "For in the one spirit we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – and we were all made to drink of one Spirit" (1Cor 12:13). This passage reminds us how different each of us are and that when we are baptized into the body of Christ, we are more than just ourselves. Every one of us is a valued part of the body of Christ. Our relationships with each other, our community, and as global citizens are defined by being one with Christ

We participate. When we are baptized – we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit, called to community to suffer and rejoice with one another. Belonging means participating. The Youth Team is excited to offer new summer ministries for grades 6-12+.


- 9-12th grades, and 2024 High School graduates, are invited to experience God's creation in a Boundary Waters and North Shore Trip, August 5-9.

- The fall 2024 benevolence letter generated \$3,890 in donations, slightly over last year's donations.
- Altar Guild- Mary Glaser reported a balance of \$717.64, generated through memorials and semi-monthly after-church coffees. They hope to purchase a new funeral banner and acolyte gown.
- Christ's Crafters–Mary Zimmerman conveyed they made fleece blankets for 13 senior graduates and will make 9 for this year's seniors.
- Women's Fellowship—Joyce Hellickson recounted the group's activities
 for the year that included discussions, community outreach, including a
 Bundles of Love promotion that resulted in over 400 items collected by
 the congregation for infants. Monthly offerings totaling \$977 went toward
 vacation bible school, postage for donated communion ware to a church
 in Puerto Rico, kitchen items, headphones for Fillmore Central students,
 and centerpieces for Fellowship Hall tables.
- 2025 budget of \$4630-approved.
- The group's guidelines were amended to include that terms end after the January budget meeting and guidelines will be reviewed annually.
- We thank outgoing chair Diane Johnson for her leadership as well as her contributions for reorganizing this group. We welcome Sue Grooters to the role of Vice Chair, replacing Janet Erdman who will become Chair.
