Merry Christmastide! When we celebrate the twelve days of Christmas, December 25 through January 5, we move from celebrating the light entering the world in human flesh; to recognizing we are the light, sent out into the world to share God's love. During Christmastide, this majestic mystery often calls us to slow down and be more reflective. Students are home from school and many of us take time off work. Some of us slow down so much we playfully ask, "What day is it?"

The language used to describe the light of God in John, Ch. 1 of *The Message Bible* captivates me.

What came into existence was Life, and the Life was Light to live by.
The Life-Light blazed out of the darkness; the darkness couldn't put it out.

The magi saw God's' light and found their way to Christ. Epiphany, which we will observe in worship on January 5, celebrates their arrival. By following the light of the star, the magi are embraced by the one true God, and through them we see God welcomes everyone and their unique gifts. The magi showed their respect for Christ with gold, frankincense, and myrrh. We also offer our gifts and talents to further the brightness of God's new dawn. No matter how simple, God accepts and uses our gifts for God's purpose.

In 2024 the people of God of Christ Lutheran shared our gifts generously. **Generosity Moments** have enlightened us on how gifts of time, talent, and treasures have nurtured our Vacation Bible School ministry; supported children and youth attending Bible camp and the Youth Gathering; encouraged gifted crafters, bakers, and organizers to welcome people to our Craft and Bake Sale; invited members to visit care centers and homes to stay connected with those who are unable to get out and about; prompted youth to host a Painted Pumpkin Fundraiser to benefit those hit by hurricanes . . . and the list goes on.
